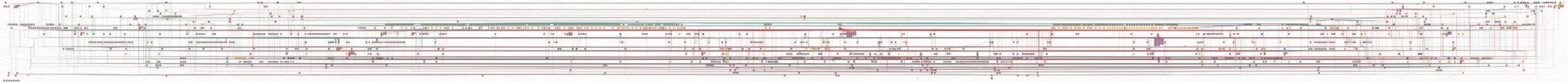


# Public private partnership

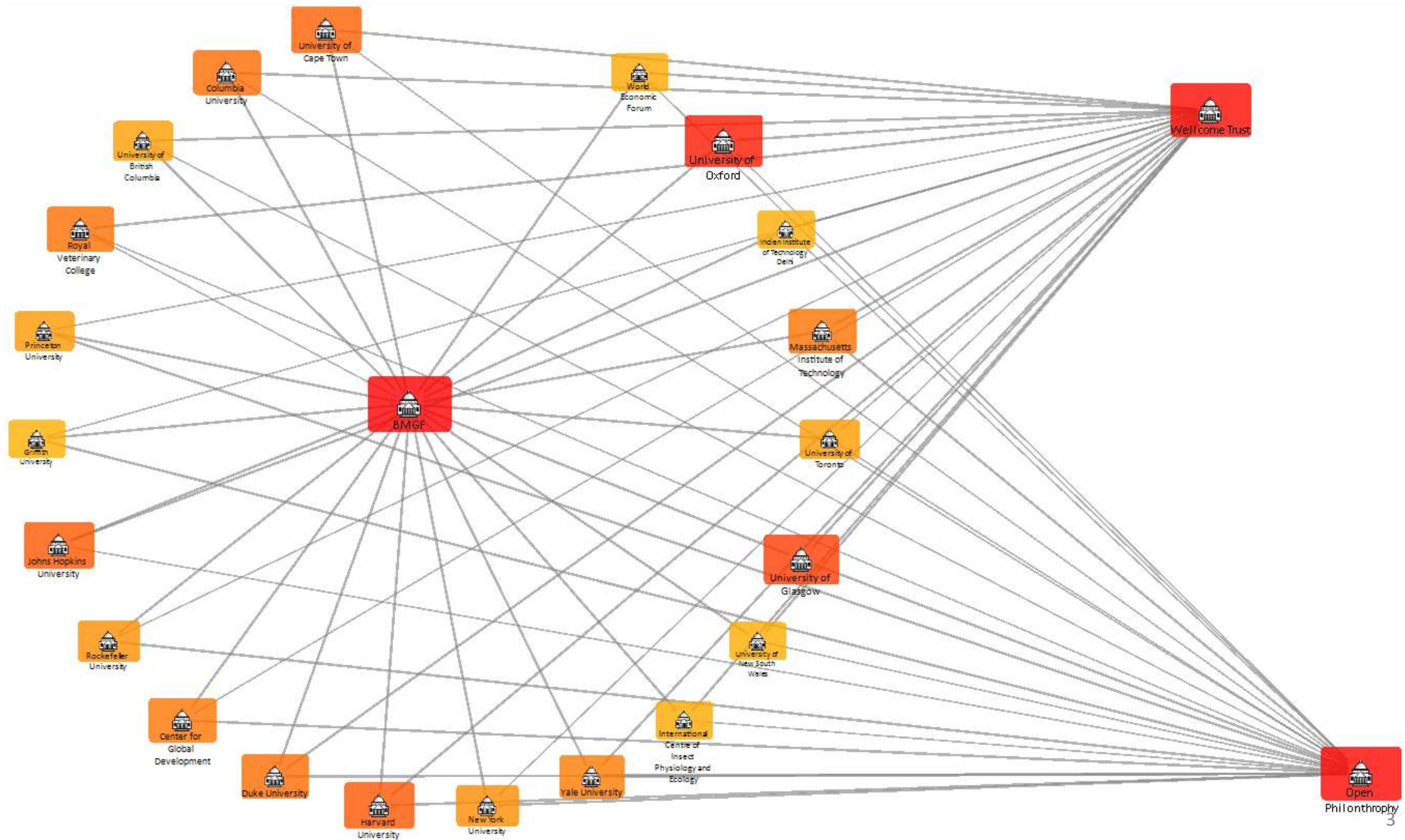
